Presented by historian **David Kiehn** - from boxing matches to before and after the 1906 earthquake - A Trip Down Market Street (35mm) to a early Air Meet in Tanforan (in 1912 it was still a race track), they captured the San Francisco Bay Area at the turn of the last century. This will be a really informational and interesting program.





2:00 pm LITTLE ORPHANT ANNIE Greg Pane, Piano Accompaniment

(1918, Selig Polyscope, 35mm restoration by Eric Grayson) Adversity in young Annie's life leads to strange fantastical imaginings which she conveys to other "orphants" as cautionary tales. Adapted from the poem "Little Orphant Annie" and short story "Where Is Mary Alice Smith?" by James Whitcomb Riley, with Colleen Moore starring in one of her earliest roles. Much of the exterior location filming was in Pleasanton (Alameda County). This dramatic film may not be suitable for small children.
